The European Elections of 2009

- Is European Democracy Possible?

Two interpretations are possible of this year's European Elections.

The first is that the whole concept of European democracy is illusory and flawed. The European Elections are, at best, surrogate of national elections.

The other analysis is that the European Elections of 2009 prove the need for changes in the conduct of the European Elections and that with such changes the European Elections can become an important building block of democracy in the European Union.
